Geographically the land of the Moab is just over the Jordan from Israel The Moabite nation finds its origin in the incestuous relationship of Lot and his daughters – <i>Genesis 19:37-38</i> Moabite women are involved in the seduction of Jewish men and turned them to the god Baal of Peor and a subsequent plague ensued- <i>Numbers 25</i>	Ruth 2:11–12 - But Boaz answered her, "All that you have done for your mother-in-law since the death of your husband has been fully told to me, and how you left your father and mother and your native land and came to a people that you did not know before. 12 The LORD repay you for what you have done, and a full reward be given you by the LORD, the God of Israel, under whose wings you have come to take refuge!"

Ruth 4:9–10 - Then Boaz said to the elders and all the people, "You are witnesses this day that I have bought from the hand of Naomi all that belonged to Elimelech and all that belonged to Chilion and to Mahlon. ¹⁰ Also Ruth the Moabite, the widow of Mahlon, I have bought to be my wife, to perpetuate the name of the dead in his inheritance, that the name of the dead may not be cut off from among his brothers and from the gate of his native place. You are witnesses this day."

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A destitute widow to a wealthy wife -Ruth 4:13a - So Boaz took Ruth, and she became his wife....

A childless young woman to a blessed young mother - *Ruth 4:13b* - *And he went in to her, and the LORD gave her conception, and she bore a son.*

An obscure Moabite to the great grandmother of a king - *Ruth 4:18*–22 - *Now these are the generations of Perez: Perez fathered Hezron*,...²¹ Salmon fathered Boaz, Boaz fathered Obed, ²² Obed fathered Jesse, and Jesse fathered David.

A nobody from nowhere to the genealogy of Jesus - *Matthew 1:5–6*, 16b - And Salmon the father of Boaz by Rahab, and Boaz the father of Obed by Ruth, and Obed the father of Jesse, ⁶ and Jesse the father of David the king. And David was the father of Solomon by the wife of Uriah...of whom Jesus was born, who is called Christ.
