

A. Joseph in \_\_\_\_\_ – **Genesis 37:1-36**

1. The \_\_\_\_\_ of Joseph - **Genesis 37:1–2a** - *Jacob lived in the land of his father's sojournings, in the land of Canaan. <sup>2</sup> These are the generations of Jacob. Joseph, being seventeen years old, was pasturing the flock with his brothers. He was a boy with the sons of Bilhah and Zilpah, his father's wives.*

2. The \_\_\_\_\_ about Joseph - **Genesis 37:2b–4** - *And Joseph brought a bad report of them to their father. <sup>3</sup> Now Israel loved Joseph more than any other of his sons, because he was the son of his old age. And he made him a robe of many colors. <sup>4</sup> But when his brothers saw that their father loved him more than all his brothers, they hated him and could not speak peacefully to him.*

3. The \_\_\_\_\_ from Joseph - **Genesis 37:5–7, 9** - *Now Joseph had a dream, and when he told it to his brothers they hated him even more. <sup>6</sup> He said to them, "Hear this dream that I have dreamed: <sup>7</sup> Behold, we were binding sheaves in the field, and behold, my sheaf arose and stood upright. And behold, your sheaves gathered around it and bowed down to my sheaf." ....<sup>9</sup> Then he dreamed another dream and told it to his brothers and said, "Behold, I have dreamed another dream. Behold, the sun, the moon, and eleven stars were bowing down to me."*

4. The \_\_\_\_\_ to Joseph - **Genesis 37:18- 20** - *They saw him from afar, and before he came near to them they conspired against him to kill him. <sup>19</sup> They said to one another, "Here comes this dreamer. <sup>20</sup> Come now, let us kill him and throw him into one of the pits. Then we will say that a fierce animal has devoured him, and we will see what will become of his dreams."*

5. The \_\_\_\_\_ for Joseph – **Genesis 37:26-28** - *Then Judah said to his brothers, "What profit is it if we kill our brother and conceal his blood? <sup>27</sup> Come, let us sell him to the Ishmaelites, and let not our hand be upon him, for he is our brother, our own flesh." And his brothers listened to him. <sup>28</sup> Then Midianite traders passed by. And they drew Joseph up and lifted him out of the pit, and sold him to the Ishmaelites for twenty shekels of silver. They took Joseph to Egypt.*

6. The \_\_\_\_\_ about Joseph - **Genesis 37:32–34** - *And they sent the robe of many colors and brought it to their father and said, "This we have found; please identify whether it is your son's robe or not." <sup>33</sup> And he identified it and said, "It is my son's robe. A fierce animal has devoured him. Joseph is without doubt torn to pieces." <sup>34</sup> Then Jacob tore his garments and put sackcloth on his loins and mourned for his son many days.*

B. Joseph in \_\_\_\_\_ – **Genesis 39:1-20**

1. \_\_\_\_\_ by Potiphar - **Genesis 39:1** - *Now Joseph had been brought down to Egypt, and Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the captain of the guard, an Egyptian, had bought him from the Ishmaelites who had brought him down there.*

2. \_\_\_\_\_ by the LORD - **Genesis 39:2–4** - *The LORD was with Joseph, and he became a successful man, and he was in the house of his Egyptian master. <sup>3</sup> His master saw that the LORD was with him and that the LORD caused all that he did to succeed in his hands. <sup>4</sup> So Joseph found favor in his sight and attended him, and he made him overseer of his house and put him in charge of all that he had.*

3. \_\_\_\_\_ by Potiphar's Wife – **Genesis 39:7-20**

a. The assault by Potiphar's wife – **Genesis 39:7-13**

1) Temptation by words – **Genesis 39:7** - *And after a time his master's wife cast her eyes on Joseph and said, "Lie with me."*

2) Temptation by persistence - **Genesis 39:10** - *And as she spoke to Joseph day after day, he would not listen to her, to lie beside her or to be with her.*

3) Temptation by deed – **Genesis 39:11-12** - *But one day, when he went into the house to do his work and none of the men of the house was there in the house, <sup>12</sup> she caught him by his garment, saying, “Lie with me.” But he left his garment in her hand and fled and got out of the house.*

b. The accusation by Potiphar’s wife – **Genesis 39:14-15, 20** - *She called to the men of her household and said to them, “See, he has brought among us a Hebrew to laugh at us. He came in to me to lie with me, and I cried out with a loud voice. <sup>15</sup> And as soon as he heard that I lifted up my voice and cried out, he left his garment beside me and fled and got out of the house.” ... <sup>20</sup> And Joseph’s master took him and put him into the prison, the place where the king’s prisoners were confined, and he was there in prison.*

C. Joseph in the \_\_\_\_\_ – **Genesis 39:21 – 40:23**

1. The LORD shows His \_\_\_\_\_ – **Genesis 39:21-22** - *But the LORD was with Joseph and showed him steadfast love and gave him favor in the sight of the keeper of the prison. <sup>22</sup> And the keeper of the prison put Joseph in charge of all the prisoners who were in the prison. Whatever was done there, he was the one who did it.*

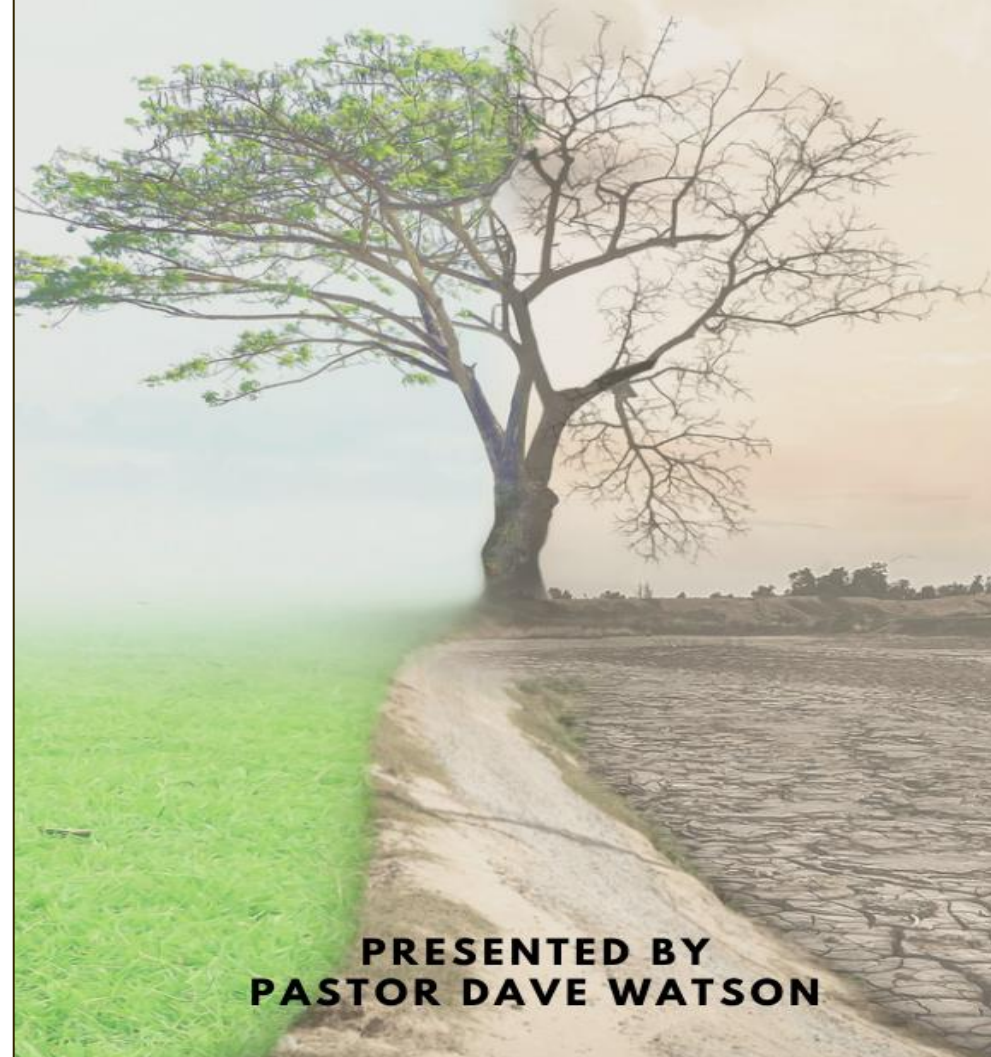
2. The LORD shows His \_\_\_\_\_ – **Genesis 40:1-4** - *Some time after this, the cupbearer of the king of Egypt and his baker committed an offense against their lord the king of Egypt. <sup>2</sup> And Pharaoh was angry with his two officers, the chief cupbearer and the chief baker, <sup>3</sup> and he put them in custody in the house of the captain of the guard, in the prison where Joseph was confined. <sup>4</sup> The captain of the guard appointed Joseph to be with them, and he attended them. They continued for some time in custody.*

3. The LORD shows His \_\_\_\_\_ - **Genesis 40:23** - *Yet the chief cupbearer did not remember Joseph, but forgot him.*
