First Words:

The <u>Picture</u> with Jesus

Luke 5:8–11 - But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Depart from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord." ⁹ For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish that they had taken, ¹⁰ and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." ¹¹ And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.

The central truth we find in this story is that Peter is amazed at the miracle of the catch of fish performed by Jesus. He falls at Jesus feet he is told not to be afraid because from now on they shall catch fish. Arriving at the shoreline they all leave all and follow Jesus.

Assumption

- Believer = Disciple = Christian - These are not three different classes of Christ-followers but three synonymous terms for Christ-followers.

The Pattern of Jesus

- 1. Like Jesus we need to use our temptations to obey God *Luke 4:1-12*
- 2. Like Jesus we need to use our temple to be empowered by God *Luke 4:14*
- 3. Like Jesus we need to use our time to serve God Luke 4:42-44
- 4. Like Jesus we need to use our trials to trust God Luke 22:39-46
- 5. Like Jesus we need to use our trespassers to imitate God *Luke* 23:32-38

The Prescription from Jesus

Luke 5:27-28 - After this he went out and saw a tax collector named Levi, sitting at the tax booth. And he said to him, "Follow me." ²⁸ And leaving everything, he rose and followed him.

Luke 9:23–25 - And he said to all, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me. ²⁴ For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will save it. ²⁵ For what does it profit a man if he gains the whole world and loses or forfeits himself?

Luke 14:26-27 - "If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. ²⁷ Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple.

The Parables of Jesus

Construction - Luke 14:28-30 - For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it? ²⁹ Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, ³⁰ saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.'

Military – *Luke 14:31-32* - Or what king, going out to encounter another king in war, will not sit down first and deliberate whether he is able with ten thousand to meet him who comes against him with twenty thousand? ³² And if not, while the other is yet a great way off, he sends a delegation and asks for terms of peace.

Emphasis - Luke 14:33 - So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple.

Simon of Cyrene - *Luke 23:26* - And as they led him away, they seized one Simon of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, and laid on him the cross, to carry it behind Jesus.

The <u>Practices</u> for Jesus


- 1. I need to make sure I have made a life-altering commitment to follow Jesus Christ, trusting wholly on His death on the cross and resurrection for my salvation
