Mark 15:24–25 - And they crucified him and divided his garments among them, casting lots for them, to decide what each should take. 25 And it was the third hour when they crucified him.

Mark 15:33 & 37 - And when the sixth hour had come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour. 37 And Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed his last.

Thursday Night

The Last Supper – Judas leaves – John 13:30 – After 9:00 P.M.

Jesus & his disciples walk by the temple to Gethsemane – John 15-17

Gethsemane – Mark 14:32-42

Jesus is betrayed by Judas – Mark 14:43-50

Friday Morning

Jesus before Annas, father-in-law of the High Priest

Jesus before the High Priests Caiaphas –

Christ is blindfold, beaten and blasphemed - Luke 22:63-65

Good Friday

6:00 A.M.

Jesus before the Sanhedrin – Luke 22:66-71 (Day = after 6:00 A.M.)

Jesus stands before Pilate – Luke 23:1-5

Jesus stands before Herod – Luke 23:6-12

7:00 A.M.

Jesus returns to Pilate – Luke 23:11

Jesus is sentenced to death – Luke 23:23-24

Jesus is rejected and Barabbas is set free

Jesus is scourged and beaten – Matthew 27:26-31

8:00 A.M.

Jesus is lead away to Calvary – Luke 23:26-31

– Helped by Simon of Cyrene

9:00 A.M. – The Third Hour

Jesus is crucified – Between two thieves - Mark 15:25

Jesus has his garments gambled for – Matthew 27:35

Jesus asks forgiveness for his adversaries – Luke 23:34

And Jesus said, “**Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.**”

And they cast lots to divide his garments.

10:00 A.M.

Jesus is insulted and mocked by the mob – Matthew 27:39-40

Jesus is mocked by the Jewish leaders – Mark 15:31

Jesus is mocked by the soldiers – Luke 22:36-37

Jesus is insulted by one of the thieves-Luke 22:39

11:00 A.M.

Jesus speaks to the other thief on the cross - Luke 23:43

And he said to him, “**Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise.**”

Jesus speaks to Mary and John - John 19:26–27

When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his mother, “**Woman, behold, your son!**”²⁷ Then he said to the disciple, “**Behold, your mother!**” And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.

Jesus and the whole earth are in darkness for 3 hours – Mark 15:33

- He suffers the wrath of God for our sin, for my sin and your sin, His soul is made an offering for sin

3:00 P.M.

Jesus cries out to the Father - Mathew 27:46

And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, “Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?” that is, “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?”

Jesus cries out for hydration – John 19:28

After this, Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfill the Scripture), “I thirst.”

Jesus cries out in victory - John 19:30

When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, “It is finished,” and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

Jesus cries out giving up his spirit and expires - Luke 23:46

Then Jesus, calling out with a loud voice, said, “Father, into your hands I commit my spirit!” And having said this he breathed his last.

After 3 P.M. but before sundown


Jesus’ death is followed by the Veil of the temple is being torn in two from top to bottom as well as an earthquake – Matthew 27:51-52
