

First Words:

A. A \_\_\_\_\_ Word – **Hebrews 3:1-6**

1. The \_\_\_\_\_ – **Hebrews 3:1a** – “Therefore, holy brothers, you who share in a heavenly calling....”

2. The \_\_\_\_\_ – **Hebrews 3:1b -3** – “....consider Jesus, the apostle and high priest of our confession, <sup>2</sup> who was faithful to him who appointed him, just as Moses also was faithful in all God’s house. <sup>3</sup> For Jesus has been counted worthy of more glory than Moses—as much more glory as the builder of a house has more honor than the house itself.

3. The \_\_\_\_\_ – **Hebrews 3:4-6** - (For every house is built by someone, but the builder of all things is God.) <sup>5</sup> Now Moses was faithful in all God’s house as a servant, to testify to the things that were to be spoken later, <sup>6</sup> but Christ is faithful over God’s house as a son. And we are his house, if indeed we hold fast our confidence and our boasting in our hope.

B. A \_\_\_\_\_ Word – **Hebrews 3:7-11**

1. The Holy Spirit’s \_\_\_\_\_ – **Hebrews 3:7-9** - Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says, “Today, if you hear his voice, <sup>8</sup> do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion, on the day of testing in the wilderness, <sup>9</sup> where your fathers put me to the test and saw my works for forty years.

2. The Holy Spirit’s \_\_\_\_\_ – **Hebrews 3:10-11** - Therefore I was provoked with that generation, and said, ‘They always go astray in their heart; they have not known my ways.’ <sup>11</sup> As I swore in my wrath, ‘They shall not enter my rest.’ ”

C. A \_\_\_\_\_ Word – **Hebrews 3:12-18**

1. An \_\_\_\_\_ – **Hebrews 3:12-14** - *Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. <sup>13</sup> But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called “today,” that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. <sup>14</sup> For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end.*

2. An \_\_\_\_\_ – **Hebrews 3:15-18** - *As it is said, “Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion.” <sup>16</sup> For who were those who heard and yet rebelled? Was it not all those who left Egypt led by Moses? <sup>17</sup> And with whom was he provoked for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the wilderness? <sup>18</sup> And to whom did he swear that they would not enter his rest, but to those who were disobedient?*

3. An \_\_\_\_\_ - **Hebrews 3:19** - *So we see that they were unable to enter because of unbelief.*
